

HIP HOP DANCE SOUTH AFRICA: CRITERIA FOR AWARDING PROVINCIAL AND NATIONAL COLOURS

To qualify for Provincial or SA Protea colours the following is required:

- Must be affiliated to HHDSA (Hip Hop Dance SA)
- Participate in Provincial & National Championships
- Achieve the required scores set for each section.

The above will be added to get a score out of 100 and each Judges Score will be used to calculate a final mark **out of 10.**

JUDGING CRITERIA

Judges will use the following criteria to eliminate dancers up to the point where we have one final Battle in a specific category:

CREATIVITY
PERFORMANCE
TECHNIQUE
CHARACTER
MUSICALITY

Provincial Colours

At any Provincial Competition the **Top 6** World Qualifier Dancers (solo or Duo) in each

respective category will receive Provincial Colours.

Protea Colours

Hip Hop International Rules stipulate that only **3** Dancers per section may represent a country at the World Championship, thus:

Top 3 Dancers in each category will qualify to receive Protea Colours (Recognised by SASCOC) and a SA tracksuit when representing South Africa at the World Hip Hop Championship.

Provincial Colours

- At any Provincial Competition, Crews in the World Qualifying Section must receive a minimum score of **6.5/10** to receive Provincial colours.
- Dancers qualify for a Provincial track suit when <u>representing</u> the Province at the SA National Championships.
- Provincial track suit with the appropriate emblem.
- If you do not participate at the National Championship, you will not be awarded Provincial colours.

A substitute cannot qualify for, or obtain Provincial Colours without actual participation at the Provincial Championships

Protea Colours

- Crews with a Score of **7.5 and Higher** will qualify to receive Protea Colours (Recognised by SASCOC) and a SA tracksuit when representing South Africa at the World Hip Hop Championship.
- The International Body (Hip Hop International) Rules stipulate that only **3** Crews per section (Junior, Varsity, Adult and MegaCrew) may represent a country at the World Championship, a maximum of three (3) crews per section (with the required qualifying score) may participate in International World Championships.
- The National Championships is the qualifying round for all international events
- Competitors <u>must</u> participate at Provincial and National level first before they can participate at the International level
- Substitutes <u>must participate in at least 1 round</u> of competition in the Provincial and National Championships to be able to qualify for Provincial and National colours and receive a medal.
